Development Permits

- material change of use
 - roadside stall
 - rural industry
 - home based business
 - nature-based tourism
 - food and drink outlet
 - shop
- building and plumbing work
- operational work (earthwork, access, parking, landscaping)



Seeking Advice

Council's development advice services:

- Initial advice / general enquiries
- Written advice / town planning appraisals
- Pre-lodgement meeting



Application Preparation

Things to consider when preparing a development application:

- Site constraints
- Environmental risk management (e.g. flooding, bushfire)
- Ecological protection (e.g. waterways, native vegetation)
- Required technical plans and reports
- Building design and services
- Access and parking arrangements
- Landscaping and rural amenity
- Noise management
- Waste management
- Stormwater management



Getting Approval

- Timeframes will vary depending on the types of approvals, level of assessment and number of applications required
- A code assessable application may take 3-6 months to be processed (material change of use, operational work)
- Building certification private certifier
- Plumbing applications & inspections
- Post construction inspections





Event Planning


Things to consider when operating a business / event:

- Public liability insurance (\$20 million & SCRC as Interested Party)
- Community consultation
- Catering
- Security
- Emergency management
- Alcohol management
- Noise management
- Traffic and parking management
- Waste management
- Risk management
- Public safety

- complete application form, pay the application fee and submit your application (allow time for the approval process – this varies depending on what you are planning)
